I have knowledge of the requirements for testing (SBAC, NAA, and Science) as well as FERPA, discipline, attendance, and graduation requirements (have been NDE [Nevada Department of Education]) liaison for the CCSD graduation rate for the past six years (meaning, I validate and verify the graduation rate that has gone from 61.59% in 2012 to 83.22% in 2017).

I have worked in the Data Visualization department of AARSI for 3 year and have been instrumental in bringing the graduation rate up due to the ability of schools to see, at a glance, their students' progress. This includes being an adjunct for the Early Warning metrics that NDE has adopted according to Standford's recommends.

I am also well-versed in best practices when it comes to grading. Are we, as parents, really okay with students getting a grade for word searches and crossword puzzles? If students don't use all of their bathroom passes, their lowest grade is eliminated; grades just can't be altered because a student does not use the restroom! Standards-based learning is tied to mastery by the end of the term. Students should be allowed to make corrections on assessments or take a make-up exam without that newer score being averaged in with the initial lower grade.

Students' grades seldom recover from a "0", but yet that is what is entered in the grade book for missing work, instead of using "Late" which would not impact the overall grade unless it never is submitted.

I would like to serve as a member of Mannion Middle School's SOT because as educators we know better, and should be doing better! What can we do at Mannion to better prepare students for their future?

What qualifications, skill sets, or unique experiences do you have that you feel will be an asset to the School Organizational Team?

I have worked for CCSD for 35 years; 23 years as a third grade teacher and the remaining years as a Learning Strategist. I have extensively studied standards-based learning and best practices in grading policies.
